TechStep: Mismatched & Misconfigured In RAM Test Results

TOPIC -----

What do "Mismatched" and "Misconfigured" mean in Apple TechStep RAM size test results?

DISCUSSION -----

"Mismatched" means that a given bank contains more than one size of SIMM. When this is detected, the RAM size test puts a question mark ("?") after the RAM size.

"Misconfigured" means that RAM bank A holds less memory than bank B.

Note

The Macintosh Classic cannot be misconfigured because bank A is soldered to the logic board; therefore, it will not report a "Misconfigured" result.
